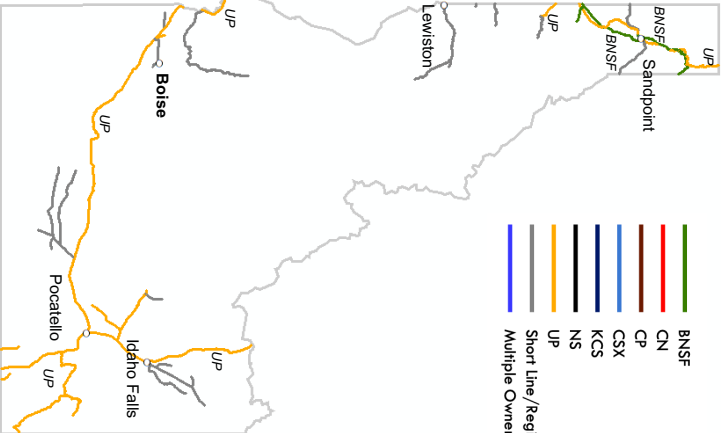


Idaho Rail Facts

- **Going the distance.** In Idaho alone, 12 freight railroads operate across 1,729 miles of track.
- **Supporting jobs.** As of 2017, Idaho freight railroads and their suppliers employed 2,326 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- **Connecting markets.** The most common commodities originating from Idaho markets are, in carloads/year: nonmetallic minerals (26,500), food products (22,300), lumber, wood products (12,400), farm products (12,000), and chemicals (11,000).
- **Powering state economies.** Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- **Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion.** Freight railroads take 6.4 million truckloads off Idaho roads annually.
- **Reducing pollution.** Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
