Maryland Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In Maryland alone, 11 freight railroads operate across 769 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Maryland freight railroads and their suppliers employed 2,997 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Maryland markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (57,500), glass and stone (8,700), waste and scrap (6,300), and other commodities (14,600).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 4.5 million truckloads off Maryland roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
