
Colorado Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In Colorado alone, 13 freight railroads operate across 2,427 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Colorado freight railroads and their suppliers employed 4,664 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Colorado markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (90,700), coal (83,100), farm products (15,100), glass and stone (14,500), and nonmetallic minerals (9,800).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 7.7 million truckloads off Colorado roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
