## **Illinois Rail Facts**

- Going the distance. In Illinois alone, 52 freight railroads operate across 6,883 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. Illinois freight railroads employed 11,772 people in 2019 and rail suppliers employed 9,418 as of 2017; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Illinois markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (2.9 million), farm products (208,500), coal (200,200), nonmetallic minerals (128,600), and food products (92,400).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 28.2 million truckloads off Illinois roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail prevented the emission of 12.5 million tons of greenhouse gases in Illinois in 2019, the equivalent of planting 189 million trees.
