## Illinois Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In Illinois alone, 52 freight railroads operate across 6,883 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. Illinois freight railroads employed 11,772 people in 2019 and rail suppliers employed 9,418 as of 2017; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Illinois markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (2.9 million), farm products $(208,500)$, coal $(200,200)$, nonmetallic minerals $(128,600)$, and food products $(92,400)$.
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly $\$ 220$ billion in U.S. economic activity and $\$ 26$ billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 28.2 million truckloads off Illinois roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail prevented the emission of 12.5 million tons of greenhouse gases in Illinois in 2019, the equivalent of planting 189 million trees.
