## **Illinois Rail Facts**

- Going the distance. In Illinois alone, 49 freight railroads operate across 7,151 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Illinois freight railroads and their suppliers employed 27,113 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Illinois markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (3.2 million), coal (332,600), chemicals (113,800), food products (99,400), and farm products (94,100).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 26.8 million truckloads off Illinois roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
