Indiana Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In Indiana alone, 41 freight railroads operate across 3,786 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Indiana freight railroads and their suppliers employed 9,193 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Indiana markets are, in carloads/year: coal (216,600), primary metal products (118,800), food products (67,600), farm products (60,000), and chemicals (33,500).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 17.4 million truckloads off Indiana roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
