## **Massachusetts Rail Facts**

- Going the distance. In Massachusetts alone, 12 freight railroads operate across 1,057 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Massachusetts freight railroads and their suppliers employed 2,195 people; nationwide, freight
  rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Massachusetts markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (122,600), waste and scrap (10,200), glass and stone (1,700), chemicals (1,500) and other commodities (900).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 874,000 truckloads off Massachusetts roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
