Oklahoma Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In Oklahoma alone, 17 freight railroads operate across 3,158 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Oklahoma freight railroads and their suppliers employed 3,148 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Oklahoma markets are, in carloads/year: nonmetallic minerals (154,700), chemicals (21,700), farm products (15,700), petroleum (13,900), and other commodities (31,000).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 15.5 million truckloads off Oklahoma roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
