Rhode Island Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In Rhode Island alone, 1 freight railroad operate across 58 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Rhode Island freight rail and their suppliers employed 247 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from Rhode Island markets are petroleum, gravel and stone and intermodal.
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight rail takes 100,000 truckloads off Rhode Island roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
