## South Carolina Rail Facts

- Going the distance. In South Carolina alone, 11 freight railroads operate across 2,278 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, South Carolina freight railroads and their suppliers employed 4,294 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common commodities originating from South Carolina markets are, in carloads/year: intermodal (155,800), chemicals (28,300), lumber, wood products (18,000), primary metal products (17,000), and stone, sand & gravel (14,300).
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 3.7 million truckloads off South Carolina roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
