## **Vermont Rail Facts**

- Going the distance. In Vermont alone, 8 freight railroads operate across 578 miles of track.
- Supporting jobs. As of 2017, Vermont freight railroads and their suppliers employed 403 people; nationwide, freight rail supported about 1.1 million jobs.
- Connecting markets. The most common rail imports to Vermont are petroleum and lumber and wood products.
- Powering state economies. Spending by Class I railroads in 2017 generated nearly \$220 billion in U.S. economic activity and \$26 billion in state and federal tax revenues, according to a Towson University study.
- Preserving infrastructure, cutting congestion. Freight railroads take 401,000 truckloads off Vermont roads annually.
- Reducing pollution. Moving freight by rail instead of trucks reduces greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 75 percent.
