









SUPER STRONG FREIGHT TRAINS

One freight train can carry as much as several hundred big trucks all at once! That means fewer trucks on the road and more space for family road trips.




ENERGY-SAVING ENGINES

America's freight railroads have over 135,000 miles of track, enough to circle the Earth more than five times.


HIGH-TECH SAFETY HEROES

The last decade has been the **safest in rail history**, thanks to new technology like track-inspecting robots and special safety computers.







Locomotive – the powerful engine that pulls all the railcars behind it Switch – a movable track section that guides trains to another line Hopper – a type of freight car for bulk goods like coal or grain Gauge – the distance between the two rails on a track Intermodal – shipping that uses trains, trucks, and ships (containers!) Ballast – the crushed rock that supports the railroad ties Tank car – a railcar designed to carry liquids

Tie - the wooden or concrete beam that holds rails in place

Grade – the slope or incline of a track

Flatcar - a freight car with no sides or roof, used for large cargo
Unittrain - a train made up of cars carrying the same type of cargo
Yard - a series of tracks where trains are sorted or stored
Dispatcher - the person who directs train traffic
Coupler - the device that connects railcars together

Engineer - the person who drives the train and controls its speed
